The BLM transportation map does not show a BLM Road (i.e., Eastern Upridge Road, Map 2) at Mt. Sexton Pass connecting with BLM Road 34-6-23.

Group walked up Eastern Upridge Road to 90" corner where road's course changed from approximately south to east. It is a solid gravel road. They also walked an area west of road. They found a diversion ditch; no sign of Chicken House or House 2.
