South exit off the freeway: Best Western Grants Pass Inn- 541-476-1117 Holiday Inn Express – 541-471-6144

North exit off the freeway: Motel 6 – 541- 474-1331 Shilo Inns – 541-479-8391

Riverside Inn (along the Rogue) – 541-476-6873

Another interesting and historical option would be the **Wolf Creek Inn** in Wolf Creek 20 miles north of Grants Pass. If this is your option of choice you need to make your reservations EARLY as they have a limited number of rooms. 541-866-2474.

Tour Trail Sites (see map):

- 1847 Emigrant Sub-irrigated prairie trail encampment/ Davis Military Warrant House Location.
- Harris Creek Ford of Trail on ODOT managed land.
- Harris Family Cabin location along the Trail where Mary Harris lost her husband, son and a hired hand during 1855 Rogue River Indian War.
- 1846 1847- Rogue River's Pierce Riffle Crossing-confirmed with diary entries.
- 1846 Rogue River Vannoy Creek Ford Lindsay Applegate's notes
- 1855 Haines Apple Tree
- 1855 verified survey Illinois Valley Route of Trail with swale
- Widow Niday house site along the trail-burnt during the 1855 Rogue River Indian War
- 1846 site at Grave Creek where Martha Leland Crowley was buried
- Approximate 1846 location of where the emigrants encamped for the night on the north side of Mt. Sexton where Martha Leland Crowley died of Typhoid Fever.
- Trail traces at South Rat creek in north Grave Creek hills
- 310' segment of the Trail on Mt. Sexton Summit improved as a military road by Major Alvord in 1853.

You will need water, good walking shoes and a sack lunch for the day.
