

## Jacksonville Road (JR) Of Applegate Trail (Trail): Niday DLC Survey (JA-10C)<sup>1</sup>

**Hugo's Jacksonville Road (JA) from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville** (route of the Applegate Trail) is located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north. There are 17 General Land Office (GLO) surveyed points of interest (POIs) along the JR in Hugo's area of interest.<sup>2</sup> JA-10C is not a GLO survey; it is a DLC survey.

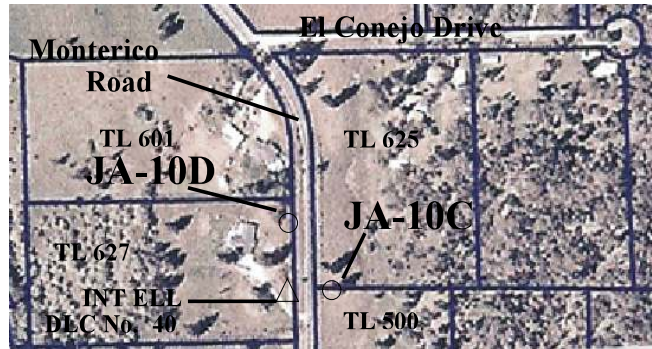
## Diaries, Journals, & Reminiscences<sup>2</sup>

**Monterico Road** JA-10C locates the JA Road almost on the Monterico Rd. between El Conejo Drive and Monteflora Rd. It reduces the unknown from sites approximately a mile apart (JA-10A to JA-11) to ½ mile apart and confirms working hypothesis that Monterico Rd where it is orientated NW & SE is the *Trail*.

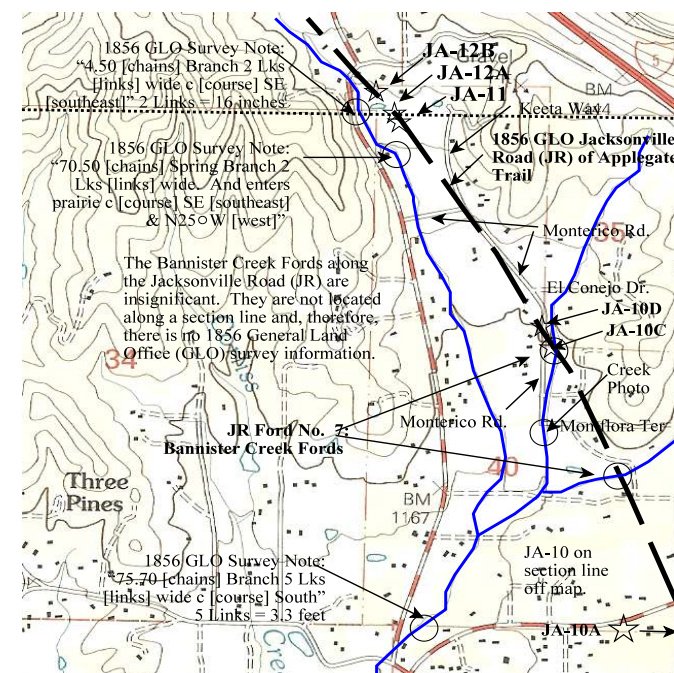
