### Jacksonville Road (JR) Of Applegate Trail (*Trail*): 1941 At Mt. Sexton Pass<sup>1-2</sup>

**Hugo's JA from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville** (route of the Applegate Trail) is located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north. There are 17 GLO surveyed



points of interest (POI) along the JR in Hugo's area of interest.<sup>3</sup> There are many more like this 1941 At Mt. Sexton Pass POI without a GLO survey.

**In 1941** a new right-of-way on Sexton Mountain was cleared.<sup>4</sup> The residence [Smith house] overlooking the Pacific Highway summit on the shoulder of Mt. Sexton was razed and trees felled for a new road.

### Postal Telegraph Pole At Mt. Sexton Pass

**1941** The "*Right-of-way Cleared on Sexton*" photo is courtesy of the *Grants Pass Courier* from its January 6, 1941 edition.<sup>4</sup> The following is the caption to the photo (Photo 1):

"The residence [John S. W. Smith homesteaded in 1877; he was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon September 16, 1896 (Patent No. 3749)] overlooking the Pacific highway summit [Smith Hill] on the shoulder of Mt. Sexton has been razed, and trees are being felled for 1.92 miles of new construction soon to take place there. Here is a view toward the summit from the Grants Pass side showing the steep, old dirt road on the left [Applegate Trail], the curving present highway on the right [Old Pacific Highway/U.S. 99], and the felled trees on the rightof-way of the new work. The highway summit will be lowered several feet by a deep cut. (Courier Photo and Engraving.)."

The grade of the *Trail* segment at Mt. Sexton Pass aligns to the original summit elevation. The Postal Telegraph pole shown in Photo 1 would have been removed with the eventual 1941 cut.

**2010** Today's view from the old Pacific Highway shown in the 1941 picture is the same one as after the 1941 and 1950s I-5 elevation cuts (see title page).
