

Jacksonville Road (JR) Of Applegate Trail (*Trail*): Twogood Survey (JA-17C)¹

Hugo's Jacksonville Road (JA) from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville (route of the *Trail*) is located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north. There are 17 GLO surveyed points of interest (POI) along the JR in Hugo's area of interest.² JA-17C is not a GLO survey; it is a DLC survey.

Private Ownership The 1855 GLO plot of JA-17B on the 1996 Glendale Quad identified the POI is located approximately 350' - 400' west of the Sunny Valley Road (SVR) on Tax Lot 1900. The difference between the early *Trail* location (between JA-17B & JA-17C) and its later evolution to today's SVR is consistent with many other road segments (e.g., Oxyoke Road, Highland Avenue at Harris Creek, Donaldson Road, Monument Drive away from Schoolhouse Creek, etc.) which moved from the wet, muddy, winter bottom lands to the toe of slopes.

8/00 Road to Umpqua Valley course N & S [8 chains = 528'. The center of the SVR as depicted on the 1996 USGS 7.5 minute quad is approximately 620' from the northwest DLC corner and approximately 100' west of the SVR. JA-17C is approximately 2,500' north of JA-17B].

17/50 Set a post for the N.E. corner from which a Laurel 12 in. dia bears S75" W 15 lks a B Oak 15 in. dia bears S12" E 55 lks a S. Pine 48 in. dia bears N47" E 45 lks [17 chains = 1,122'. 50 links x 7.92" = 396"/12 = 33' + 1,122' = 1,155']

Josephine County Tax Lot Map Calculations based upon the Josephine County Assessor map place JA-17C approximately 200' west of the SVR.

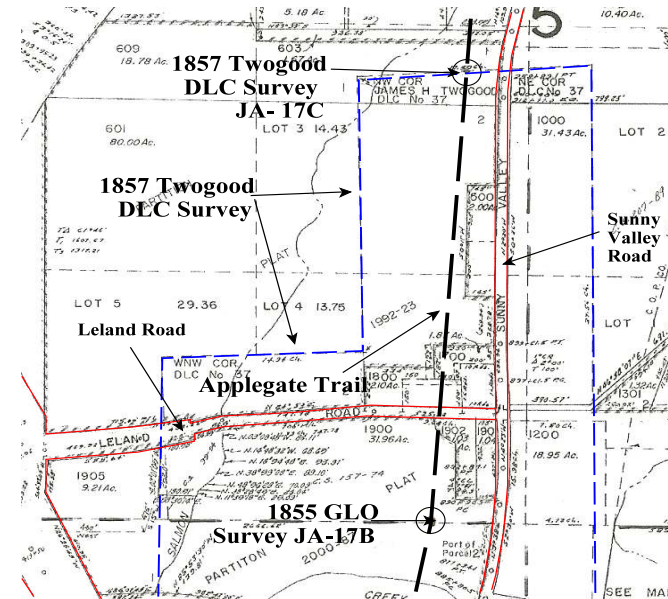

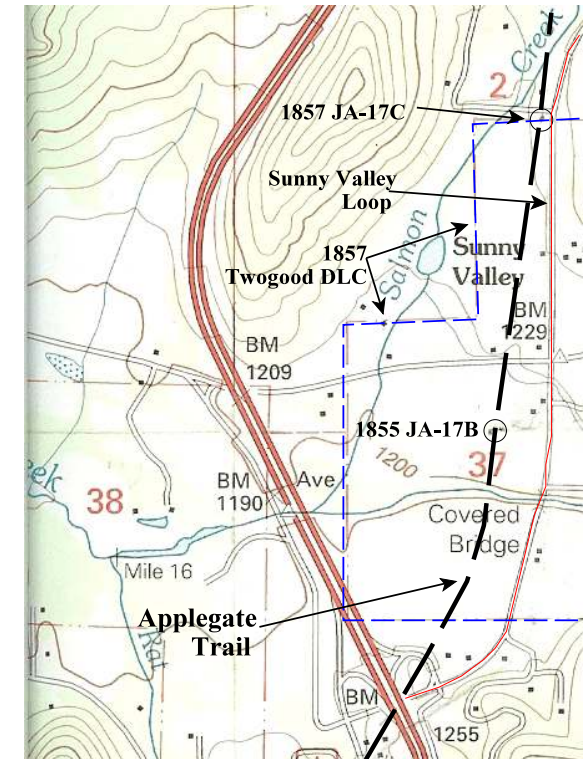
