

## Illinois Valley (IV) Road Of Applegate Trail (*Trail*) Points Of Interest (POI)<sup>1</sup>

Hugo's two 1850s GLO *Trail* emigrant routes are located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north.

- **JACKSONVILLE ROAD (JA)**
- **ILLINOIS VALLEY (IV) ROAD to Illinois Valley via Van Noys Ferry** (route of the Applegate Trail from Widow Niday's place to ferry location on Rogue River)

There are 33 identified GLO points of interest (POIs) on Hugo's two emigrant routes.

**POI Code** The foundation for Hugo's 17 digit POI code is the Oregon-California Trails Association's (OCTA) mapping emigrant trails (MET) program.<sup>4-5</sup>

**GLO Surveyed POIs Along The IV Road of the *Trail*** There are nine GLO surveyed POI along the IV Road in Hugo's area of interest.

## Diaries, Journals, & Reminiscences<sup>2</sup>

Jacksonville, Oregon continued to grow and over time the JR would become the main road through northern Josephine County. The IV Road became a secondary road important locally. North from the Rogue River the IV Road was located upstream along Vannoy Creek over the ridge into Louse Creek downstream to Jumpoff Joe Creek and from their upstream along Bannister Creek to Widow Niday's place at the Niday's Road Fork (i.e., junction of IV Road and JA of the Applegate Trail).
