

Haines House Of Applegate Trail (*Trail*): IV-H-6¹

Hugo's Applegate Trail houses are located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north. There are six GLO surveyed points of interest (POI) along the *Trail* in Hugo's area of interest.²

1856 GLO Haines House The Haines house is located on the GLO map. It coordinates are approximated by measuring distances on the GLO map and locating these distances on a topographic map. Need QC.

GLO Map West between sections 21 & 16 = 3,815'.

123° 25' 09.5" West Longitude Need QC.

Pringle on IV Road diary notes:

“Saturday, October 17, 1846 – Travel 8 miles, road good and a good camp which is not common, the country being mostly burnt. 8 – 2,218 miles.” Travel from camp on north side of Rogue River to camp approximately ½ mile northeast of Jumpoff Joe Creek.” [Almost 2 miles north of the 1855 Haines House location].

Haines Apple Tree Historical Marker There is a historical marker placed by the Josephine County Historical Society (JCHS) at the Haines apple tree near where the Haines house had previously stood. The following is on the interpretive sign:

“October 9, 1855. Homestead where the Haines family were massacred. Mr. Haines was found murdered and scalped. His young sons were killed with tomahawks. Mrs. Haines and a daughter were taken captive. Later killed and their bodies thrown in the Rogue River near Hellgate. Volunteer militia found this horrible scene duplicated many times in the Rogue Valley on that tragic day.”


