## General Land Office (GLO) Surveys & Points of Interest (POIs)<sup>1</sup>

**Emigrant Trail** is the name collectively applied to the network of wagon trails throughout the American West during the middle 19th century, used by emigrants from the eastern United States to settle lands west of the Rocky Mountains. The term specifically applies to three interrelated routes: the Oregon Trail, Mormon Trail, and California Trail, including the Applegate Trail (*Trail*), a branch of the California Trail. An estimated 500,000 emigrants used these trails from 1843-1869, with up to one-tenth dying along the way, usually due to disease.

The *Hugo Emigrant Trails Committee* was formed May 2005 to bring together all those who want to learn more about the early transportation in the Hugo area. The project's aim is to collect and record information about Hugo's segment of the *Trail*.

**Hugo's** *Trail* is located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the



north. There are presently thirty-three (33) 1850s GLO surveyed POIs/Waypoints along Hugo's two emigrant routes of the *Trail*.<sup>1-2</sup>

**GLO Surveys & Maps** are useful documentary resources for identifying emigrant trails. These are the original federal township surveys starting in the 1850s.

# Waymarking, Trailblazing, & Wayfinding On Public Lands

**Waymarking & Wayfinding** is an activity in which people can locate and find the *Trail* with a Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver and a digital camera. The goal is that participation in waymarking leads some to become more knowledgeable of their community and to become interested in local history.



**Trail blazing**, or trailblazing, is the practice of marking the *Trail* with blazes or signs.

## Geotrailing The Applegate Trail

**Geotrailing The Applegate Trail** is an outdoor activity in which the participants use a GPS receiver or other navigational techniques to seek trail markers on public lands in the Hugo region.

What is the meaning of the word Geotrailing? The word Geotrailing refers to GEO for geography, and to TRAILING, the process of finding an historic emigrant trail. In this case the Applegate Trail in northern Josephine County, Oregon.

**Be Respectful** Do not trespass. Most Trail locations are on private property not open to the public. Some of these public POIs/Waypoints can be located without permission. Others require authority from the land manager. For example, JA-6, JA-7, and JA-H-2B are managed by the Josephine County Sportsman Association and require permission.
