Hugo's Jacksonville Road (JA) from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville (route of the Applegate Trail) is located in Josephine County, Oregon from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north. There are 17 GLO surveyed points of interest (POI) along the JR in Hugo's area of interest.²

Diaries, Journals, & Reminiscences¹

Public Ownership Unlike most of the POIs for the "Road from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville, JA-3 is located on a 60' wide public road at the center line of the quarter mile long Clydesdale Drive. This POI is a small saddle in the Louse Creek drainage for a minor ridge north of Colonial Valley with an northeast to southwest orientation. North of JA-3 and Clydesdale Drive is a private mobile home park. Private residences are south of the drive.


This is sensitive issue and potentially a trespass issue if visitors do not know <u>exactly</u> where they are within the public right-of-way.

1900 Commissioners' Journal⁴ "In the matter of the Road petition of Albert Morris et al for wagon road, beginning at a point were the old Overland Stage line crosses the Section line, between Section 23 and 26, Twp 35 & R 6 West, thence running East on said Section line to a point 80 rods [1,320'] west of the N.E. Corner of Sec. 25..." This section of the wagon road became San Francisco Street and Clydesdale Drive. The Commissioners' action included "Also to vacate that portion of the old military road situated in Sec. 25." The old military road was the Applegate Trail that is visible on a 1939 aerial photo in Section 25.

Local Access Road Walker's field trip to Public Works on November 20, 2009 confirmed that Clydesdale Drive was a "local access road" which means a <u>public road</u> that is not a county road, state highway or federal road. ORS 368.001(3)⁵ The eastern half of the road is primarily used as a private driveway. Best access to the undeveloped western half is from Highland Ave.


