The General Land Office Field Survey Sub-Committee transcribed the field notes of five locations for the GLO's 1856 maps¹ and calculated their latitude and longitude November 2005 (i.e., ■ JA-11 - ■ JA-15). This included

developing the methodology for translating the notes, converting chains to feet, and plotting bearing and distances in feet on



USGS topographic quadrangles. The last step was calculating the latitude and longitude from the plots on the quads. This effort is the prototype for calculating the latitude and longitude for all of Hugo's 30 points of interest.
