1800 General Land Office (GLO) Field Survey Notes

Hugo's Applegate Trail routes of interest are located from Louse Creek in the south to Grave Creek in the north.

- Road from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville (route of the Applegate Trail)
- Road to Illinois Valley via Van Noys Ferry (route of the Applegate Trail from Widow Niday's place to ferry location on Rogue River)

A problem for early surveyors was the mineral attraction in the ground deflecting the needle of their magnetic compass just enough to produce the errors. By knowing the location of the sun in relation to his position on the earth, the surveyor could adjust the solar compass for the sun's declination. On February 26, 1836 Burt's solar compass was issued patent number 9428X.

There are 17 major "road" GLO field note locations for the "Road from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville" within Hugo's routes of interest. They are numbered JA-1 through JA-17. There are nine major "road" GLO field notes for the "Road to Illinois Valley via Van Noys Ferry" within Hugo's routes of interest. There are seven GLO field survey notes that identified houses which were close to the road, fields, prairies, and fences. In total there are 33 GLO field note locations within Hugo's Applegate Trail routes of interest.

Purpose of General Land Office Field Survey Sub-Committee

The purpose of the General Land Office Field Survey Sub-Committee is to transcribe the 33 GLO field note locations within Hugo's Applegate Trail routes of interest and, ultimately, to calculate the latitude and longitude for each location. This includes developing the methodology for translating the hand written notes, converting chains to feet, and plotting bearing and distances in feet on USGS topographic quadrangles. The last step is calculating the latitude and longitude from the plots on the quads (i.e., degrees, minutes, and seconds). In our area of the world a second of latitude is about 100 feet and a second of longitude is about 75 feet.

One link = 7.92 inches One rod = 16.5 feet One chain = 66 feet 80 chains = one mile

The final latitude and longitude coordinates will be used by the *Sub-Committee* with Global Position System (GPS) devices to location the actual emigrant roads and house locations on the ground.
