1895 Gordon's father, J. C. Cochrane, owned 240 acres in Hugo, Oregon in 1895 that were on the main Applegate Trail.¹ The 160-acre 1861 military patent by Davis/Heatt included most of the open wetlands of what would become the J. C. Cochrane Ranch.²⁻⁶

1910s The Town of Three Pines, Oregon was a going concern in the early 1910s. However, the Three Pines mill and lumber town had declined by ca., 1915 - 1917. Except for some homes and the Three Pines School the Town of Three Pines was disappearing.

The Gordon Cochranes, Early Pioneer Family: 1898 - 1975

1920 Census. Merlin Precinct, Josephine Co., OR Laborer <u>Gordon Cochran</u> was living with the Louis E. Wilson family in Three Pines, Oregon.

1925 - 1927 Gordon started his teaching career in 1925 at Three Pines School.⁷ Verlin Grimes had lived in the Town of Three Pines from 1925 - 1941. "Gordon Cochrane was his 6th grade teacher. He also had teacher Cochrane in the seventh grade. Verlin felt he was a good teacher and patient with his students. The first fall a Baptist Minister came through Hugo on a chapel car, a railroad car made up like a chapel. The chapel car stayed in Hugo a week or so for a revival meeting. Some after-noons Gordon would load his students in his 1923 Chevrolet touring car and take them to the revival. Verlin and the other kids especially enjoyed a watermelon feed they were treated to the last Saturday the minister was in Hugo."⁸

Gordon's occupation was grade school teacher.

1937 Ralph Kolkow started first grade during the 1937 -1938 school year when Gordon Cockran was the teacher at Three Pines Elementary School. Cockran was the one teacher for all eight grades. In 1937 all teacher, Mr. Cochran, wanted to teach was arithmetic. He did not teach Ralph Kolkow his "A, B, Cs." Ralph learned his A, B, Cs from the other kids — from John Webb, Martin Brazille, and his brother Charles Kolkow.⁹

Gordon Cochrane, School Teacher

1960 Gordon would recall for the newspaper that "Schools Better Way Back When!".⁷ Kids just did not get the fine points of good grammatical construction.
