1911 "F. C. Farwell, recently of Nevada, has joined with Mr. Cook in forming the Farwell Construction company. Mr. Rolph, of the famous Burrell orchards is also a member of the company and has purchased some of the fruit tracts, and will improve and plant to orchard."

"The Farwell Construction company are rebuilding the Mittlestett store building, and will use the same for offices. Mr. Farwell, who is a builder, is superintending the work." Rogue River Courier. March 31, 1911. <u>Three Pines</u>.

1911 "Three Pines is doing things these days that will make the other valley towns sit up and take notice. The Farwell Construction company at that place is installing a water system at the mill and making other first-class improvements. Regis & Colby, contractors, will next week begin the construction of a commodious new school building." Rogue River Courier. March 31, 1911. <u>Three Pines</u>.

1911 "*Mr. Farwell has returned from Wolf Creek with his family and they are now at home in this place.*" *Rogue River Courier.* May 5, 1911. <u>Three Pines</u>

"The trench for the water pipe of the Three Pines company has been finished. On the arrival the pipe will be place and soon there will be a sufficient and convenient supply of water for all who may care to avail themselves of the privilege." Rogue River Courier. May 5, 1911. Three Pines

Town of Three Pines, Oregon Platted

"The Farwell Construction company is sinking the well that will supply this community with plenty of pure water for all domestic purposes, as well as for local irrigation. Fred C. Farwell, of the company, is clearing a five-acre tract and will plant to pears. Mr. Cook will go to Portland in a few days to purchase pipe for the water system." Rogue River Courier. June 2, 1911. Three Pines.

1911 "The Farwell Construction company is rushing work on the deep well, which will supply water to the people here. Mr. J. D. Cook, of this company, is now in Portland purchasing the material for install the water system. Mrs. Cook accompanied him and will remain for a extended visit with her daughter, Mrs. Oliver Lutz, and other relatives and friends." *Rogue River Courier*. June 9, 1911. Three Pines.

"A carload of pipe has arrived and is being laid by the Three Pines townsite company, and will soon be furnishing water to the homes of all who wish to avail themselves of the privilege." *Rogue River Courier*. July 14, 1911. <u>Three</u> Pines.

"The pump for the water system is being installed and the pipe placed." Rogue River Courier. July 28, 1911. <u>Three Pines.</u>

1912 "October 16, 1912, Monday evening there was a gathering at the school house in response to an invitation of *Mrs. Nicholson*, our school teacher, to see what could be done in the way of entertainments; the result was the organization of the "Three Pines Debating club." A temporary organization was effected in the election of *F. C. Farwell*, chairman; Erma Vanderbilt, secretary; Mrs. George Baer and Mrs. Nicholson to have charge of the first entertainment to be held on October 24." Rogue River Courier. October 18, 1912; June 14, 1912.

1925 - 1941 Verlin Grimes lived in the Town of Three Pines just below the school house from 1925 - 1941. "As far as Verlin and Doran Grimes knew there was never any water in the depression or hole at the top of Reservoir Hill in Three Pines. There was an old six to eight inch wooden water pipeline that came west down from the top of Reservoir Hill behind the north side of the Grimes house. It was held together with wire on the outside and coated with tar, but as far as anyone knows it was not ever used. It was surmised that the plan was to eventually use the water from the flume to fill the reservoir, but the plan never came to fruition."¹
