California Oregon Power Company or COPCO

1911 - 1947 The California Oregon Power Company, was better known as COPCO. It was formed in 1911 to serve southern Oregon and northern California. COPCO was acquired by Standard Gas & Electric in 1925. In 1947 COPCO became independent again, partly as the result of the 1935 holding company act.

1961 In 1961 Pacific Power and Light Company merged with COPCO. With the COPCO acquisition, Pacific jumped to 411,000 customers from 318,000, and reached annual revenues of \$90 million.

The company is now part of PacifiCorp.



1984 PacifiCorp was formed in 1984, when its electric utility, natural resource development and telecommunications businesses grew into full-fledged enterprises. PacifiCorp operates as Pacific Power in Oregon, Washington and California; and as Rocky Mountain Power in Utah, Wyoming and Idaho. In 1989, it merged with Utah Power & Light, and continued doing business as Pacific Power and Utah Power. The company was acquired by MidAmerican Energy Holdings Company in 2006.
