McCormick Hotel: ca., 1916 - 1920

*"Mrs. McCormick was partly of Indian descent. Mrs. McCormick had a boarding house for the railroad men. Mary [Mary Ellen (Ritchie) Fitzpatrick] can remember sitting and playing with Edith McCormick [Bagley] when her little Indian mother (dressed like an Indian) was there sitting in the corner over by the fireplace. Her Indian mother never talked or said anything, but her eyes would kinda sparkle when the kids did something humorous while playing."*¹

The Winnie Bagley Family, Hugo Settlers: 19?? - 19??

*"Edith and Mary would sit in front of the fireplace and play when it was raining outside. The McCormicks had this rooming house and Mary would love to go there because they had an upstairs, halls, and downstairs while in comparison the Ritchies lived in a shack that did not have those neat features. Edith called her grandmother "Nanna." Mary remembers that Nanna always had these good things in the boarding house and she would give these good things to the kids and Mary would love it."*¹

George's occupation was hotel keeper.

Mrs. Winnie Bagley and Mrs. Harry Schmidt spent Saturday in Grants Pass shopping. *Rogue River Courier*. May 21, 1920. Hugo. Mrs. C. H. Willison, Mrs. Harry Schmidt and Mrs. Winnie Bagley drove to Grants Pass Tuesday. *Rogue River Courier*. June 11, 1920. Hugo. Mrs. Winnie Bagley and son, Wesley visited in Grants Pass Saturday and Sunday. *Rogue River Courier*. August 20, 1920. Hugo.

1940s Wayne McKy knew some of the McCormicks, especially Edith Bagley. She lived in the old Hugo Boarding House/Hotel for many years. She had a son, Truman Sommers, that DeLoss Downes and Wayne went to Hugo Elementary School with in the mid 1940s. Wayne was also in the Oregon National Guard with Truman for a good many years.³
