1912 -20 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school. By 1917 the Three Pines Lumber Company was in financial trouble and the town was in decline. In 1920 all that was left of the Town of Three Pines was some homes and the Three Pines School.

The Baker Family, Hugo Settlers: ca., 1925 - 1934

1928 Baker's Three Pines Home "Verlin's [Grimes] eighth grade teacher [Three Pines School] was Bertha Gigler. She later married Ben Baker, who was a logger and miner up Jump-off Joe Creek. She married Ben the same year that Verlin graduated from the eighth grade in May 1928. After they were married Ben and Bertha lived in a little yellow house about 50 feet from the Ludwick home. The yellow house had previously been used as an office when the old planning mill was operating in Three Pines ca 1910 - 1914. The Grimes family eventually tore the old yellow house down and used the wood to remodel their own home."¹

1929 Ben Baker was a logger, miner, and Carrol Brown's scoutmaster. Carrol spent a lot of time placer mining with Baker during the 1929 - 1935 period. They used a sluice box/rocker while gold mining on the Rogue River from Grants Pass to Grave Creek. Sixteen old Carrol summer logged with Barker around Fort Klamath.²

1931 Mrs. Bertha Baker, our grade teacher for next year, has finished her course at Southern Oregon Normal school and is residing in a tent near the new home now being built. *Grants Pass Bulletin.* August 28, 1931. Hugo Items.

Baker's Hugo Home "During the summer of 1931 Frank Holden and Lela Sexton and others quit claimed about three acres just south of the school [Hugo] to Ben and Bertha (Gigler) Baker. The couple built a little house there right next to the church [Hugo]. Bertha Baker taught at the Hugo Elementary School. Later after the Bakers left the little house became a room for the teachers."¹

Gold Miner & School Teacher

Teacherage & Parsonage The home the Bakers built would become a teacherage for the Hugo School, and eventually became a parsonage for the Hugo Community Church.

1932 At their meeting last week, the school board of Dist. 22, Hugo, reelected Mrs. Bertha Baker to the grade school and Mrs. Rena Hales Holdman to the high school. *Grants Pass Bulletin*, March 4, 1932. Hugo Items. "Bud" or Charles Baker of Eureka and his sister, Miss Ethyl Baker, of Gold Beach, arrived at the Baker home for the July 4 holidays. *Grants Pass Daily Courier*, July 8, 1932. By H. E. Walker. <u>Three Pines</u>.

1933 At the last meting of the school board Mr. Earle A. Brown, formerly of Medford and Ione, was elected to teach the high school next year. Mrs. Bertha Baker is to have the grade school work again. *Grants Pass Bulletin*, February 24, 1933. Hugo.

1934 Teacher Baker, passed away in 1934.

1930s - 1940s Ben Barker and Glen McKy were partners at the Hyden Mine (hard rock gold mine) and in other mining ventures. He had a lot of mining claims around the county with his dad, George Baker. They also lived up Jumpoff Joe Creek.³
