1903 "The Three Pines Timber Co. was incorporated last week in Medford. The incorporators are: A. E. Reames president; Geo. E. Howland vice president; J. D. Cook, secretary; W. I Vawter, treasurer. The principal place of business of the Three Pines Timber Co. Will be in Medford, the company having secured rooms in the Palm Lodge building which they will soon fit up for offices. The company has extensive timber holdings in both Jackson and Josephine counties and will probably develop a big timber industry during the present season." Rogue River Courier. April 30, 1903. Three Pines Timber Co.

## George Howland, Three Pines Businessman

1910 "The town of Three Pines, in Josephine County, is booming, according to the statement of G. E. Howard, a leading lumber manufacturer of that place. The Three Pines Lumber Company, operating a large saw-mill at that place, is making substantial improvements in its plant. A new planing mill is almost ready for operation and a new sawmill is being erected as rapidly as possible. About 400,000,000 feet of timber are to be flumed down and cut at this mill." Rogue Magazine. "The town now has 100 inhabitants, two stores, and a hotel. A great many houses will be built there this winter as nearly everyone at this time is living in a tent. The town now has three trains a day stopping there and a new depot has been built." Rogue Magazine. December 1910. Three Pines.

Rough lumber arrived at the Three Pines planing mill via a flume from Mountain, Oregon which is in the headwaters of Jumpoff Joe Creek.

1911 "Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Howland of Grants Pass came up on the morning train. Mr. Howland is doing some surveying for the timber company. Mrs. Howland is the guest of Mrs. Cook and Mrs. L. T. Corliss. Mr. Howland is the architect for the school house to be built, and well he may be congratulated for the plans he has made." Rogue River Courier. March 31, 1911. Three Pines.

# Vice President of Three Pines Timber Company

1911 "Mrs. Arthur Howland of Winona was a caller on friends at this place Monday. She went with Mrs. Geo. Howland of Grants Pass, to the train. The latter has been spending some time visiting at Winona while Mr. Howland has been looking after his mining interests at and near Mountain, where the Mt. Pitt mine is located, and in which he is interested. He also was looking after placer ground in which he is a large owner." Rogue River Courier. August 25, 1911. Three Pines.

"Mr. Howland has returned to Grants Pass from his mining property on Jump Off Joe, where he has spent several days looking after his interests in that line. Mrs. Howland accompanied him on the trip." Rogue River Courier. December 8, 1911. Three Pines.

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot.

**1920** U.S. Census Almeda Co., CA Fifty-one year old George was by himself as a lodger. His occupation was machinist in a shipyard.

**1951** George Elihus Howland died October 6, 1951 in Almeda County, California. He is buried in Linden Grove Cemetery. His tombstone identifies he was born in 1864 versus death index of 1865.
