Hugo's Pioneers: 1800s

At a minimum, for purposes of the Hugo's Pioneers brochure series, a Hugo pioneer includes anyone who received a final 1800s land patent from the U.S. government for our region.¹⁻² In most cases this means that they were proving up, at a minimum, for five to 10 years prior to receiving their final patent. Others will be identified who were born or lived in Hugo in the 1800s, especially those that made the overland journey prior to 1871 when the crosscontinental train service became available, and before 1883 when train service became available in southern Oregon.
