Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued December 9, 1865 to George W. Harris heirs of Harris and Mary Ann Harris.¹⁻²




Dr. Flanagan: 1884 [1883]³ Among the people gathering at the little frame

depot in October 1884 [1883] were Dr. And Mrs. W. H. Flanagan, who had been married the previous summer, June 17, 1883, in Roseburg and were making their home in Grants Pass where Dr. Flanagan was stationed as Southern Pacific railroad physician.

Mrs. Flanagan was born to Mr. and Mrs. J. V. Bradley on August 19, 1865 at Oak Creek, ten miles north of Roseburg. Dr. Flanagan was born February 1, 1885, and died February 1, 1930. He was buried Masonic.

The W. H. Flanagan Family, Hugo Pioneers: ca., 1890s -19??

1895 By 1895 Dr. W. H. Flanagan owned the old Harris DLC, and the 80 acre Bryant military warrant totaling a 400 acre ranch in the Harris Creek drainage.⁴ The main route through northern Josephine County, the Applegate Trail, went through the ranch. Flanagan was a physician until a few years before his death when he had specialized in dentistry.




W. H. Flanagan's 400 Acre Ranch: 1895

1896 Thomas J. Bryant Military Warrant On January 18, 1896 Thomas Bryant was issued a military warrant for 80 acres along the Applegate Trail in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. D143).¹⁻²


