1918 Horace Huyler's Hugo Homestead No. 1 On August 2, 1918 Horace Edsell Huyler was issued a homestead certificate for 80 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 09191).¹⁻²

1919 Horace Huyler's Hugo Homestead No. 2 On December 30, 1919 Horace Edsell Huyler was issued a homestead certificate for 80 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 011894).¹⁻²

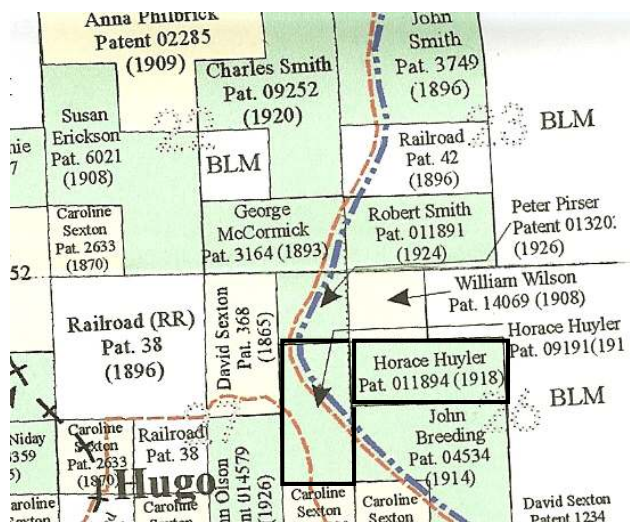
The homestead was adjacent to another ranch-homestead dedicated to fruit farming - Peter Pirser's place.

1932 L. C. Bullard was in possession of the old Huyler homestead in 1932.³
