

1910s The Kuhnardts were German and their place was up the mountain between Quartz Creek and Bummer creeks. One Halloween Margaret's dad, and some of the men of the neighboring ranches, put a wagon on top of the Kuhnardt's barn. The whole valley of Quartz Creek would bet involved during Halloween and play a lot of dirty tricks involving outhouses and other buildings. The McCormicks later lived on the Kuhnardt's place. The Bland family would get peaches from the Kuhnardts for canning. Margaret thought they were wonderfully tasty peaches for winter dining.¹
