Eveline Martin, Hugo's Early Pioneers

For purposes of the Hugo's Settler brochure series, an early Hugo settler includes anyone who lived there sometime from 1900 through the 1930s. Martin was a pioneer, but is included in the settler series because of the 1900 homestead certificate.

1886 William N. Triplett passed January 6, 1886.

1892 Harison Triplett's Hugo Homestead On March 23, 1892 Harison H. Triplett was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 2858). ²⁻³

1900 Eveline Martin's Hugo Homestead On May 3, 1900 Eveline Martin was issued a homestead certificate for 40 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 4742).²⁻³


Perhaps Martin = Murray or Eveline remarried?

1902 Eveline Triplett passed. "Mrs. Triplett was a widow, her husband, Wm. Triplett, having been drowned in the Rogue River some 17 years ago. She was 49 years of age. She leaves five children, three sons, and two daughters."


