1904 Job Anderson's Hugo Homestead On October 27, 1904 Job Anderson was issued a homestead certificate for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 5639).²⁻³ The certificate was signed by President Theodore Roosevelt.

More Information

May 30, 1911 — Town of Three Pines Platted⁴ The platted town of Three Pines is the south 80 acres of the Job Anderson homestead.

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot. The town was platted and there was the Three Pines Fruit Tracts just to the east.

Anderson Creek is the north-south stream between the railroad right-of-way and today's Three Pines Road.⁵ The creek was named for the Anderson homestead through which it runs.

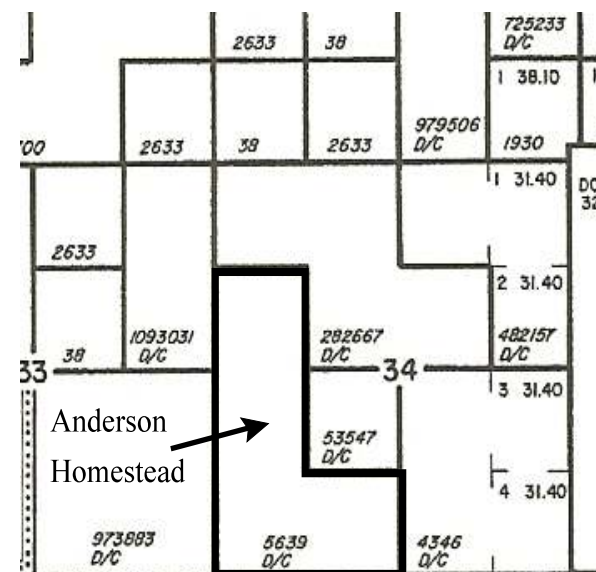
