

1896 Oregon & California Railroad Patent For a variety of reasons the final patents to the railroad for building the railroad were issued later than the work was completed. On March 17, 1896 the O & C Railroad Company was issued a railroad grant Patent No. 38 for 109,827.83acres (July 25, 1866: Grant-RR O & C (14 Stat. 239)). ¹⁻² Eighty acres of this railroad grant would be acquired by S. P. Hasseltin.

The S. P. Hasseltin Family, Hugo Pioneers: ca., 1890s

1895 By 1895 S. P. Hasseltin owned 80 acres of the old railroad patent along the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks one mile north of Merlin, Oregon.³
