1880 U.S. Daniel married Rosanna Eggenberger of Swiss ancestry on November 8, 1880 in Wabasha County, Minnesota.

1887 The family was located in Leland, Oregon by 1887 where Daniel was a Section Foreman for the Southern Pacific Railroad.

The Peterson Family: Federal Census

Daniel Peterson eventually specialized in peaches and apples. The *Hugo Heights Fruit Farm*, and other orchards, in Hugo would become famous for their fruit.²

David's occupation was practicing general farming. Sons David and Joseph were carpenters working on railroad bridge gangs. Roy and Iva were home farming.

1913 Fifty-one year old Rosanna [Rosanna Eggenberger] Peterson passed September 25, 1913 in Josephine County.³ It is assumed that Daniel Peterson had to farm his children out after his wife died.

1915 Iva E. (Mrs. John Smithpeter) Peterson passed.

1916 Single Joseph B. Peterson died in WWI.

1917 Roy Peterson was living in Hugo, Oregon.⁴

1921 Single David Peterson was killed in a shipyard in Portland, Oregon in 1921.

1934 Daniel Peterson (Jr.) passed May 15, 1934 in Josephine County, Oregon.³

1968 Single Roy Peterson passed at the Peterson ranch.³

1972 Single John Earl Peterson passed in 72.⁴

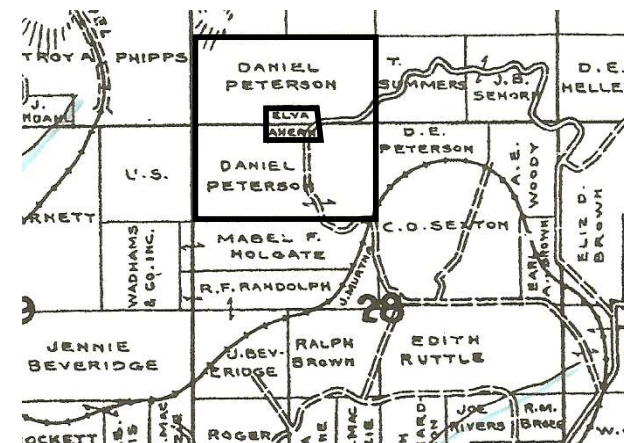
