**1887** The family was located in Leland, Oregon by 1887 where Joseph's father, Daniel, was a Section Foreman for the Southern Pacific Railroad.


Daniel Peterson eventually specialized in peaches and apples. The *Hugo Heights Fruit Farm*, and other orchards, in Hugo would become famous for their fruit.<sup>2</sup>

In 1916 single Joseph B. Peterson died in WWI.

David's occupation was practicing general farming. Sons David and Joseph were carpenters working on railroad bridge gangs. Roy and Iva were home farming.

1913 Joseph's mother, 51 year old Rosaina [Rosanna Eggenberger] Peterson passed September 25, 1913 in Josephine County.<sup>3</sup> It is assumed that Daniel Peterson had to farm his children out after his wife died.

1916 In 1916 single Joseph B. Peterson died in WWI.

1944 Daniel Emanuel Peterson Sr. passed.
