1861 - 1863: Civil War Coleman Hefling's regiment was with the Union: 24th Regiment, Kentucky Infantry, Company F.¹ - Enlisted as a Private October 8, 1861at Lexington, Kentucky. Enlisted in on December 31, 1861. Deserted from on April 10, 1863.²


