In 1893 Alfred Reames earned his law degree and began law practice in Eugene until 1894 when he moved to Portland, Oregon to continue practicing law. In 1895 he returned to Jacksonville where he practiced law until 1902.²⁻⁴

1903 "The Three Pines Timber Co. was incorporated last week in Medford. The incorporators are: A. E. Reames president; Geo. E. Howland vice president; J. D. Cook, secretary; W. I Vawter, treasurer. The principal place of business of the Three Pines Timber Co. Will be in Medford, the company having secured rooms in the Palm Lodge building which they will soon fit up for offices." Rogue River Courier. April 30, 1903. Three Pines Timber Co.

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot.
