

**1920** Mary's family moved to Wolf Creek in 1920 and then to Salem, Oregon in 1924, but the family always retained property and friendship ties in Hugo.

Mrs. H. P. Conley and two children arrived from Seattle Thursday to visit Mrs. H. W. Ritchie. *Rogue River Courier*. April 30, 1920. <u>Hugo.</u> Mrs. H. W. Ritchie arrived home Wednesday morning from Portland where she has been in a hospital for a couple of weeks. *Rogue River Courier*. July 9, 1920. Hugo.

The parts were well chosen and the characters well impersonated. The entire rendition reflects much credit upon the teachers and pupils. Between the first and second acts. H. W. **1935 Harvey Ritchie's Hugo Homestead** On December 6, 1935 Harvey Whitaker Ritchie was issued a homestead certificate for 80 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No.017987).<sup>2-3</sup>


