

John & Esther Ritchie, Early Hugo Settler Family: ca., 1910 - 1918

1910 Mary Ellen (Ritchie) Fitzpatrick's folks, Harvey Whitaker and Margaret Mary Ritchie, first came to Hugo in 1910. Her family stayed with the Petersons for awhile until they moved into the Holgate house.

1912 At the time the Ritchies were living on their homestead off the Ahern Road within a mile of downtown Hugo, Oregon. Mary Ritchie remembered the four daughters felt they were pretty poor: Margaret, Mary, Elaine, and Pat. The road to the Ritchies early home site and the home of the Fitzpatricks in 1999 was always called the Ahern Road as it went up to the old Ahern place. It was a well traveled road when Mary was born.

1918 WWI Draft: Harvey Ritchie Registered

Harvey was a farmer. His wife, Margaret Mary, was listed as his nearest relative. He had lost part of his right hand. The registrar was Thomas Mackenzie.

Union Soldier

1914 - 1918 John & Esther Jane Ritchie Passed They both passed in Hugo, Oregon. Esther Jane Ritchie died November 18, 1914. John Ritchie died June 16, 1918.

1920 Mary's family moved to Wolf Creek in 1920 and then to Salem, Oregon in 1924, but the family always retained property and friendship ties in Hugo. They started having reunions of Hugo people who had birthdays in October and she returned to Hugo every October until she passed away.


