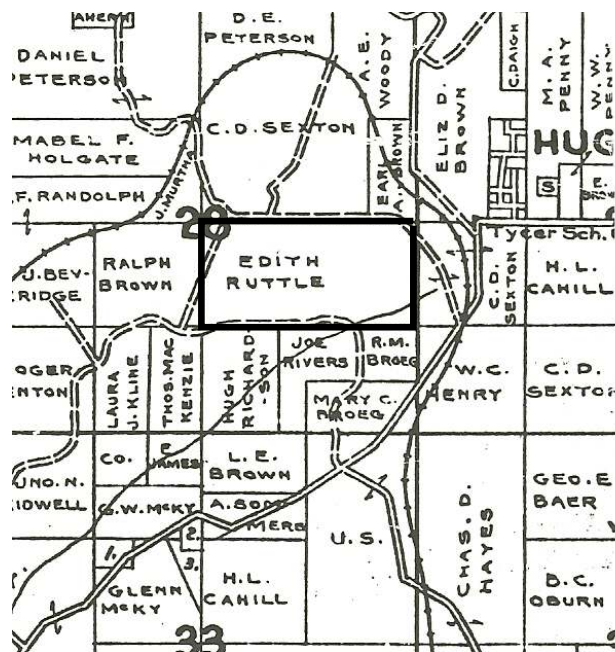

1932 By 1932 daughter, Edith, was in possession of the 80 acre Ruttle tract in Hugo, Oregon.

1947 -1951 From 1947 through 1951 Frank Buffington used the Ruttle place for many years to run his cattle and goats. When Wayne Mcky was in high school he used to go there and roundup the cows for milking every evening with his bicycle.²
