1908 Florence Snodgrass' Cash Entry Snodgrass purchased 156.72 acres under Cash Entry No. 15357 in Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued October 5, 1908 to Florence M. Snodgrass (April 24, 1820: Sale-Cash Entry (3 Stat. 566)).¹⁻²

1932 By 1932 Eldon L. Spaulding was in possession of the old Snodgrass cash entry.³

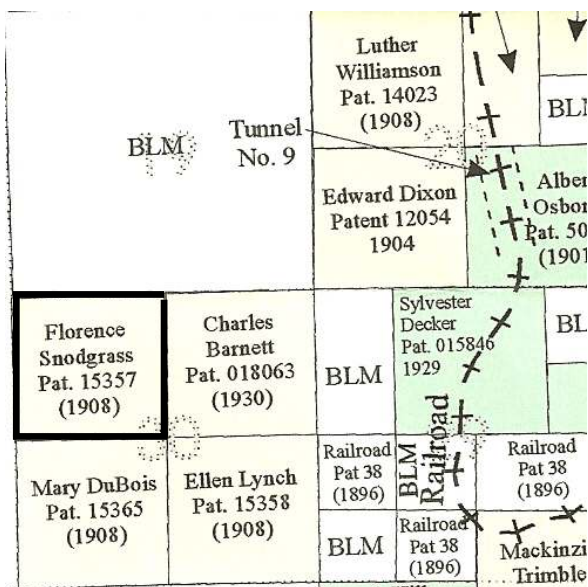
Pleasant Valley Cemetery⁵

Ernest was working in a cobbler shop.

1930 Census. Tillamook, Tillamook Co., OR

Ernest V. Snodgrass	Head	WA	1888	42 yrs
Ella G. Snodgrass	Mother	NY	1864	66 yrs

Ernest was the proprietor of a shoe shop.

At some point after 1930 Ella Snodgrass moved to Josephine County, Oregon.

1944 Ella G. Snodgrass passed November 30, 1944 in Josephine County, Oregon.⁴
