
Andrew's occupation was farming a farm he owns.

The Andrew Sommers Family, Hugo Settlers: ca., 1928 - 1936

1928 Andy and Maude Summers and their three children, Clarence, Gene, and June lived in a house by the McKys. They lived there from 1928-29 to 1935-36. Clarence and Carrol Brown became fast friends.

1932 In 1932 Andrew Sommers had a 10 acre farm.²

Earl Brown was a young five-year old when he started grade school in Hugo in 1932. This was the remodeled school that had the new enlarge north side room built in 1930.³

Bummer Creek

Earl Brown's closest childhood friends were Gene [Eugene] Sommers who lived just down the road towards Merlin (Andy Sommers' property adjacent to Browns); Gene Decker who lived ½ mile north of the Hugo school towards Mr. Sexton (John Olson property), and Doran Grimes who lived at Three Pines, Oregon. They all started grade shcool in 1932, Doran at Three Pines, and the three "Genes" at Hugo.³

1934 Clarence Sommers graduated from Hugo High School.¹

1964 California Death Index, 1940 - 1997

Andrew Sommers died in San Bernadino, California, the same place his brother, Truman, died.
