1928 - Sommers Moved To Hugo Maude and Andy Sommers and their sons, two-year old Clarence and 11-year old Eugene, moved to Hugo, Oregon in 1928. Truman, brother to Andy, and Emma Truman eventually also moved to Hugo to a location near the Southern Pacific Railroad's section house.

Andrew's occupation was farming a farm he owned.

1932 In 1932 Andrew Sommers had a 10 acre farm.²

In 1932 a T. Sommers had 40 acres high up in the Grave Creek Hills on the Ahern Road.² This property is referenced in June Sommers' oral history.¹

"The Sommers family also owned a new cabin somewhere on a road that circled around back of Hugo."

1935 Forty-eight year old Emma Sommers passed June 7, 1935 in Josephine County, Oregon.³

1957 Seventy year old Truman Frank Sommers passed August 24, 1957 in San Bernadino, California, the same place his brother, Andrew, died. He was taken back to Oregon and the Pleasant Valley Cemetery to rest besides his wife Emma.


