1951 - 1955 Wayne McKy worked with Nick Tavis (Albert) on the railroad. Wayne was chosen to go through one of the drain tunnels (i.e, the one below the Peterson place or the one below the Mike Batinich place). Nick worked for the B & B gang, but we had to go in a rebuild some of the tunnels under the railroad tracts and some of the bridges. Wayne worked on the railroad when Albert was the assistant foreman of the B & B gang of which Connor was the foreman.²

1950s In the 1950s Elic (sp.?) Tavis was bootlegging on Monument Drive and a Oregon State Policeman went by and the cop got a whiff of the mix. He stopped and went on the property and caught Elic with his still and Elic went to jail for bootlegging.²

1971 Albert Lon Tavis passed May 16, 1971 in Josephine County, Oregon. His wife was Icy. Born date of 1897 does not match his tombstone date.³


