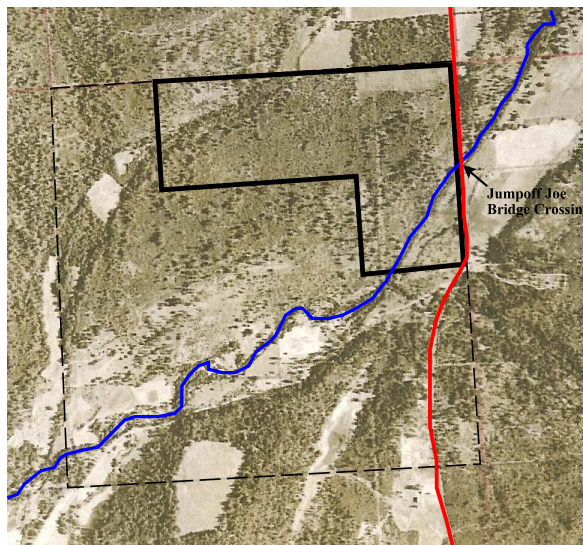
1895 Jos. McCaslin owned the homestead in 1895.¹

in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No.
3581).²⁻³

1919 It was not until 1919 that *The Antlers* was built
along the Pacific Highway in front of the McCaslin
home. The 'store' at that time consisted of a sandwich
shop and a café. They sold lunch goods, candy and
tobacco to the passerbys in covered wagons.⁶

1925 Around 1925 a gas pump was installed and the
store became the Pleasant Valley Auto Camp with a
greyhound bus stop.⁶

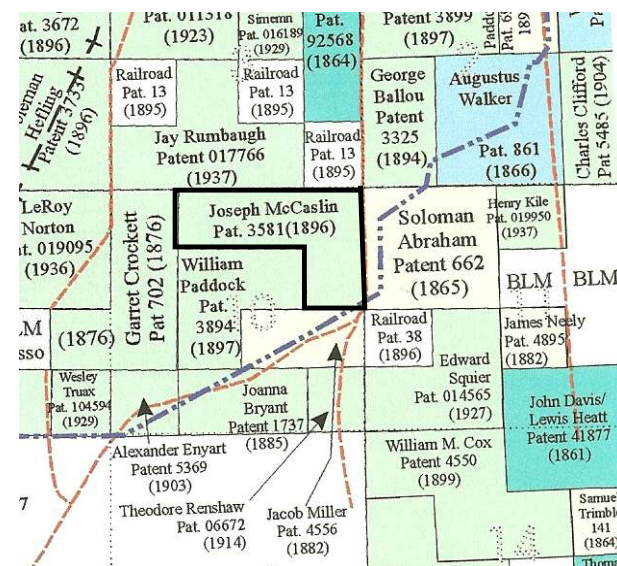
