Mrs. Bertha McCormic is quite ill. Dr. Parker was up to see her Sunday. There is no other reported case of sickness in Hugo. *Rogue River Courier*. March 4, 1910. <u>Sparks From Hugo</u>.

**1913** Mrs. George McCormie visited in Merlin Monday. *Rogue River Courier*. May 16, 1913. <u>Hugo Items</u>.

McCormick Hotel: ca., 1916 - 1920 "Mrs. McCormick was partly of Indian descent. Mrs. McCormick had a boarding house for the railroad men. Mary [Mary Ellen (Ritchie) Fitzpatrick] can remember sitting and playing with Edith McCormick [granddaughter Edith Bagley] when her little Indian mother (dressed like an Indian) was there sitting in the corner over by the fireplace. Her Indian mother never talked or said anything, but her eyes would kinda sparkle when the kids did something humorous while playing."<sup>5</sup>

"Edith and Mary would sit in front of the fireplace and play when it was raining outside. The McCormicks had this rooming house and Mary would love to go there because they had an upstairs, halls, and downstairs while in comparison the Ritchies lived in a shack that did not have those neat features. Edith called her grandmother "Nanna" Mary remembers that Nanna always had these good things in the boarding house and she would give these good things to the kids and Mary would love it." 5

McCormick home." (September 17, 1920, Hugo, Rogue River Courier), "Mrs. G. T. McCormick, who is staying in Grants Pass taking medical treatment, spent Sunday and Monday at home." (October 22, 1920. Hugo. Rogue River Courier). "Mr. and Mrs. Adam Shaffer, of Montana, are visiting a the home of the latter's sister, Mrs. Geo. McCormick." (November 3, 1920. Hugo. Rogue River Courier). Mrs. Winnie Bagley went to Merlin Sunday morning to visit her grandmother, Mrs. Smith. Rogue River Courier. March 26, 1920. Hugo.

**1930 - 1946** George McCormick passed in 1930. Nettie McCormick passed in 1946. George and Nettie share a tombstone in the Pleasant Valley Cemetery.


