1898 Hugo Homestead On November 11, 1898 William W. Wilson was issued a homestead patent for 142.8 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 4346).¹⁻²

The assumption is that homesteader William W. Wilson is cash entry William Winchester Wilson.³⁻⁴

William Winchester Wilson Family, Early Hugo Settlers: ca., 1910s?

1908 William Wilson Cash Entry Wilson purchased 40 acres under Cash Entry No. 14069 in Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued March 2, 1908 to William Winchester Wilson (April 24, 1820: Sale-Cash Entry (3 Stat. 566)).¹⁻²

1910 "Three Pines Fruit Tracts" The 1910 the old Wilson homestead was subdivided into five acre parcels where it was advertized that one could make a good living raising fruit.

After William W. Wilson sold his homestead he moved his family into Grants Pass, Oregon

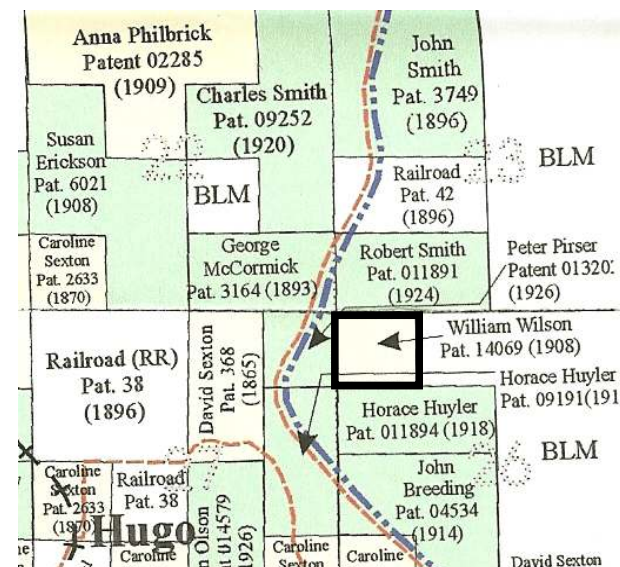
