In 1900 George Woodson was a farmer, his brother was a farm laborer, and his servant was a day laborer.

1907 Susan Tracy Woodworth passed October 26, 1907 in Josephine County, Oregon.⁴

1910 George Woodworth's Hugo Homestead On February 3, 1910 George W. Woodworth was issued a homestead certificate for 182.72 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 03735). 1-2

The homestead was adjacent to and southwest of the developing town of Three Pines, Oregon.

1910 Geo. W. Woodworth passed February 19, 1910 in Josephine County, Oregon.⁴

1912 Three Pines was a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot. The town was platted and there was the Three Pines Fruit Tracts just to the east.

1917 By 1917 the Three Pines Lumber Company was in financial trouble and the town was in decline.

Homesteader

1932 By 1932 August Lindblom was in possession of the old Woodworth homestead.³


