# 1891 C. D. Williams' Hugo Homestead On June 22, 1891 C. D. Williams was issued a homestead

certificate for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No.




6297).<sup>1-2</sup> The intent of the 1862 Homestead Act was to grant land for agriculture. James, and other claimants, had to prove they lived on the land for a minimum of five years, and made the required improvements before they were eligible to be issued

a certificate. For a variety of reasons, the "proving up" period was five to 10 years and longer.

#### The Hugh MacKenzie Family, Hugo Pioneers: ca., 1890s - 1910s

**1895** By 1895 Hugh MacKenzie had possession of the old C. D. Williams' homestead.<sup>3</sup> It was in the bottom lands of Bummer Creek and the flats of Tunnel Creek ridge, approximately two miles southwest from Hugo, Oregon.<sup>4</sup>


