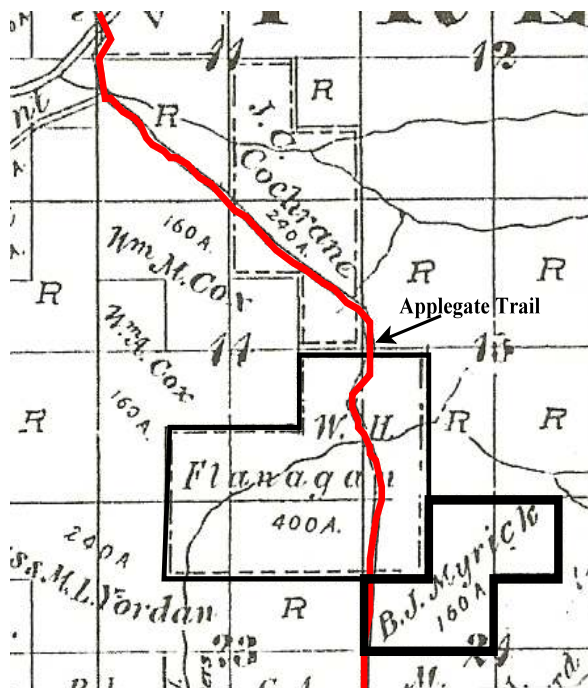

The B. J. Myrick Family, Hugo Pioneers: 18?? - 19??

1895 B. J. Myrick had possession of 160 acres east and south of today's East I-5 Manzanita Rest Area.³

In 1895 this ranch was adjacent to, and to the south east of the large 400 acre W. H. Flanagan ranch. They were both on the Applegate Trail.

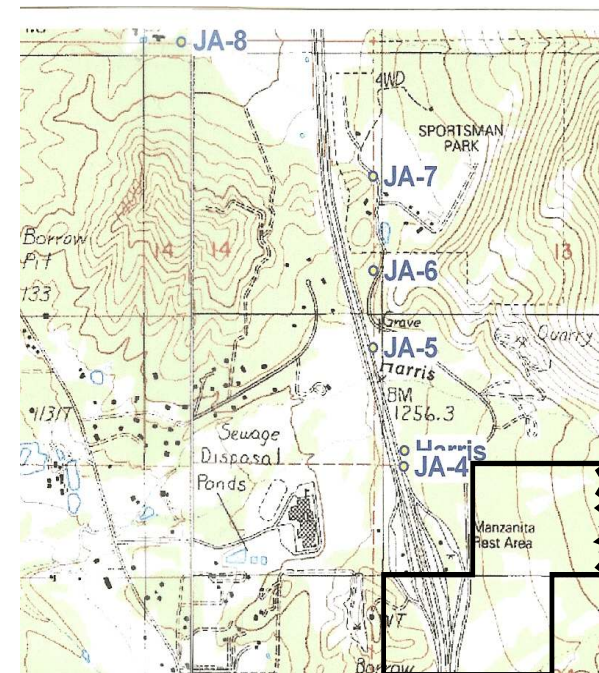
