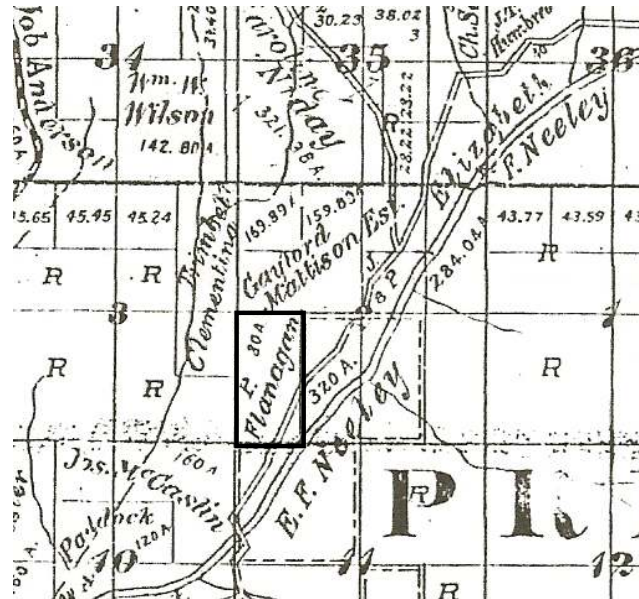

1894 George Ballou's Hugo Homestead On August 10, 1894 George D. Ballou was issued a homestead certificate for 80 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 3325).¹⁻² Reference title panel map.

The Ballou Family, Hugo Pioneers: 18?? - 18??

1895 P. Flanagan owned the Ballou homestead in 1895.³ Separate maps locate the property on the main Applegate Trail both in 1856 and 1895.

It was south of the Trimble ranch on the old Turner military warrant and north of the Jumpoff Joe Creek crossing.

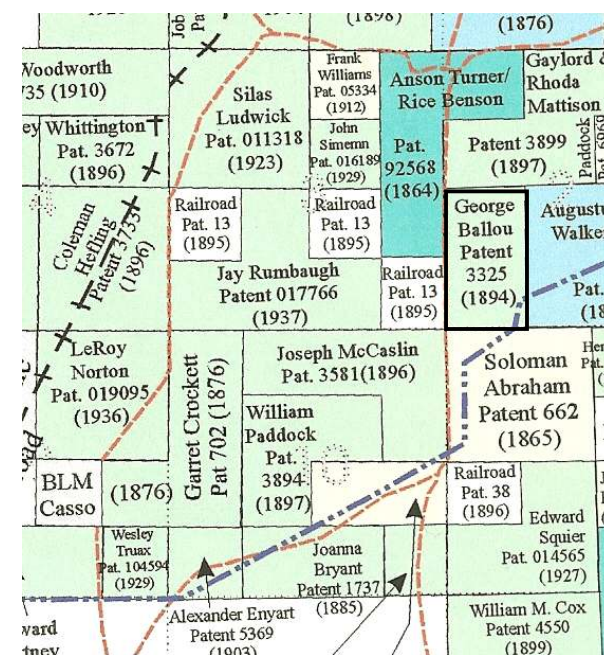
