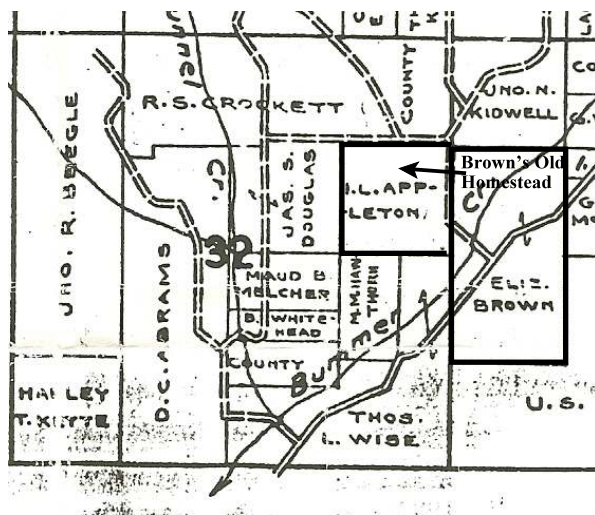
1916 Oliver Brown's Hugo Homestead On

December 7, 1916 Oliver Sevias Brown was issued a homestead certificate for 40 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 06988).¹⁻²

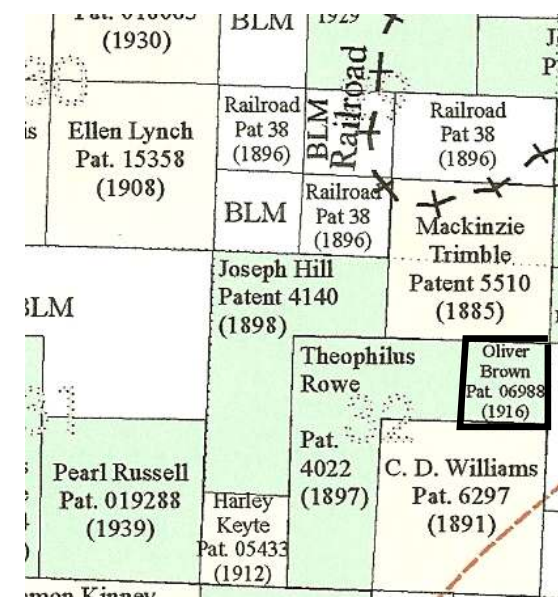
