1930 Ulysses Grant Buck passed July 25, 1930 at Josephine County, Oregon.¹

1932 Kate Buck passed March 23, 1932 at Josephine County, Oregon.¹

Confusing because Ulysses' mother, Catherine "Kate" Leighty has been identified in family history trees as passing on this date.

1943 Margaret A. Buck passed May 3, 1943 in Marion County, Oregon.¹ Margaret was the sister of Ulysses.
