1895 The Official Josephine County 1895 map records two Pollocks up Jumpoff Joe Creek: S. [Sarah] J. Pollock at Jack Creek in Section 32 and Jos. [Joseph] Pollock in Section 4.¹ William Henry, Sarah Jane, and Joseph Jacob Pollock were siblings. Their parents were William Neely Pollock and Mary Elizabeth (Ramsay) Pollock.



Leta Pollock's Memories² A horse and buggy journey all the way from Jump-Off-Joe creek to Yreka and one down into California is the long-ago memory cherished by Mrs. Leta (Pollock) Reynolds as the most important early journey of her childhood days. The trip was made with her pioneer grandparents, William N. and Mary Pollock, together with her sister, Oca [Osa], now Mrs. Oca Grable [George Homer Grable³], living north of Merlin, and her brother, Harold, now at Manzanita, Oregon. The children on the trip were three of 12 children born to William Henry Pollock and his wife, who was Mary Evabelle Kyniston – most of them born near the old Swastiki Mine, on Jump-Off-Joe creek.

The old Swastika Mine was a low gravel bank in the forks where Jack Creek flows into Jumpoff Joe Creek. (T.34S., R.5W. Section 32).⁴ In 1895 it was on Sarah J. Pollock's homestead where the William Henry Pollock's family was residing.

William Henry, Sarah Jane, and Joseph Jacob Pollock were siblings. Their parents were William Neely Pollock and Mary Elizabeth (Ramsay) Pollock.

Leta Pollock's Memories² Their schooling was mostly at the old Winona School, one of the earliest schools, and now defunct. It was nip and tuck to make ends meet with the large family of children we were – that meant that all of us had to help with the farm work, with the older ones taking care of the younger.

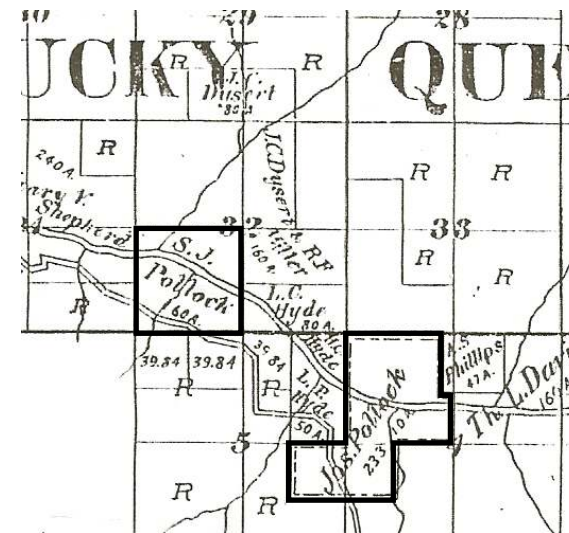
