

1910 Census In 1910, Eurydica was living with her daughter Louesa C. and son-in-law Edward C. Dixon at 614 N 6th Street, Grants Pass, Oregon. It is assumed that Eurydica soon moved to Grants Pass after her husband's death and rented their Hugo farm for others to work.

1920 Census In 1920 both women are still in Grants Pass as widows.

1939 Eurydica Crockett Passed June 29, 1939.




Crockett's Hugo Farm: 1895

1908 - late 1920s Prominent people worked the Crockett place in Tunnel Creek by the railroad tracts around 1908 - late 1920s. They probably built an old pole barn that is still there as the only barn on the Crockett place. It may be the oldest pole barn still standing in Hugo.⁴
