# **Hugo Farmer**

1912 Sixteen freight cars, nearly all loaded with way or through freight are in the ditch one mile south at Three Pines, a broken car wheel having caused the wreck of an extra out of Roseburg running as No. 221." Several railroad officials, . . . "including J. D. Cook, lumberman; Geo. Dean, blacksmith, and Lyndon Banister, farmer, constituted a board of inquiry that looked into the causes of the wreck. Their report, filed Wednesday noon, finds that no one was responsible for the wreck, it being one of those things that just happens." Rogue River Courier. January 19, 1912. S.P. Freight Train No. 221 Wrecked


