Charles D. Sexton was born on September 27, 1859,

a son of David H. and Caroline (Stumbo) Niday Sexton, natives of New York and Ohio respectively.<sup>1</sup>



Mr. Sexton was married in 1884 [January 12, 1885<sup>1B</sup>] to Miss Mary Adams, of Salem, Oregon, and to them were born two children, Frank H., born December 16, 1885, on the homestead; and Ada T., born March 2, 1890, who is the wife of J. D. Everton, of Grants Pass. Mrs. Sexton died in 1892... In 1897 [June 13, 1897]<sup>1C</sup> Mr. Sexton was again married, his second union being with Miss Tarris Drayer, a native of Nevada. To this union two children were born: Diadama T., whose birth occurred August 15, 1898; and Fred Fay, born May 4, 1900.<sup>1</sup>

**1931** Charles D. Sexton died January 3, 1931.<sup>3</sup>

**FRED FAY SEXTON** dob May 1900; dod 29 Dec 1975; Multnomah County; Spouse Veness; age 75.<sup>3</sup> In 1918, Fred was a "plummer" for the SP Railroad Co, in Nashville, Lincoln County, OR.<sup>4</sup> Sometime after 1930, Fred Fay Sexton married Vernesse S Heitman. His death index list "Veness", but I found a death index listing for "Vernesse S Sexton" with Fred listed as spouse. Cannot find Fred in 1930 census, but found Vernesse still living with her parents and listed as single. They were apparently childless.<sup>5</sup>

**FRANK HOLDEN SEXTON** was born December 16, 1885, on the Niday DLC dod 21 Mar 1949; Benton County.<sup>3</sup> Sexton, Frank H married Phillips, Lela M on 07 Feb 1909, Vol 5, Page 452, notation that bride's father is Joseph Phillips.<sup>6</sup>

In 1918, Frank registered for the draft, listing himself as a miner for "Grants Pass Crome Co".<sup>4</sup>

### 1930 Census, Corvallis City, Benton County, OR

In 1942 Frank registered for the draft again, this time listing his sister Ada Kline as "person who will always know your address".

Holden Sexton's death index indicates spouse was Marjorie. He died in Benton County 16 June 1983. Do not find her in the death index, but it's unlikely she's still alive. No apparent children.<sup>5</sup>
