Charles D. Sexton was born on September 27, 1859, a son of David H. and Caroline (Stumbo) Niday Sexton, natives of New York and Ohio respectively.¹



Mr. Sexton was married in 1884 [January 12, 1885¹⁸] to Miss Mary Adams, of Salem, Oregon, and to them were born two children, Frank H., born December 16, 1885, on the homestead; and Ada T., born March 2, 1890, who is the wife of J. D. Everton, of Grants Pass. Mrs. Sexton died in 1892. . . In 1897 [June 13, 1897] ^{IC} Mr. Sexton was again married, his second union being with Miss Tarris Drayer, a native of Nevada. To this union two children were born: Diadama T., whose birth occurred August 15, 1898; and Fred Fay, born May 4, 1900. ¹

1931 Charles D. Sexton died January 3, 1931.²

FRANK HOLDEN SEXTON was born December 16, 1885, on the Niday DLC dod 21 Mar 1949; Benton County.² Sexton, Frank H married Phillips, Lela M on 07 Feb 1909, Vol 5, Page 452, notation that bride's father is Joseph Phillips.³

ADA T. SEXTON KLINE Ada T. Sexton was born March 2, 1890. Sexton, Ada I married Everton, Jesse W on 06 Jun 1909, Vol 5, Page 475.⁴ Ada T Kline; dod 12 Jun 1945; Benton County, Oregon.² Walter H Kline; dod 22 Dec 1952; Benton County, Oregon; spouse Ada.²

Sidney Kline married Mary Belle Benedict (1907-1973) in Honolulu Hawaii in 1955. They apparently had no children (she was considerably older than he).⁵

Sidney Kline died in Honolulu HI, 14 Mar 1990; dob 15 Oct 1921.⁶

DIADAMA T. SEXTON LENNAN Dama Lennan; dob 15 Aug 1898, Oregon; dod 13 Mar 1981, San Diego; mother Drayer; father Sexton.⁷ Phillip A Lennan; dob 15 Sep 1896, Oregon; dod 21 Nov 1959, San Diego; mother Given; father Lennan.⁷

FRED FAY SEXTON dob May 1900; dod 29 Dec 1975; Multnomah County; Spouse Veness; age 75.² In 1918, Fred was a "plummer" for the SP Railroad Co, in Nashville, Lincoln County, OR.⁸

Mother Tarris Sexton's final Hugo home for the children to visit was built in 1932 (Photo 1). In 2011 this Hugo home was still there inside of the home of Kristin L. Boyce.
