David Sexton: Pioneer

1855 Caroline Niday's husband Hiram Niday died in 1855.¹

1857 Caroline subsequently married David Sexton, the Indian fighter, in 1857.² They had one child, Charles Sexton.



Landowner David Sexton David would acquire 284.25 acres in Josephine and Jackson counties under the U. S. government's 1820 Sale-Cash Entry act.³


1865 David Sexton Cash Entry Sexton purchased 80 acres under Cash Entry No. 368 in Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued August 15, 1865 to David H. Saxton (sic) (April 24, 1820: Sale-Cash Entry (3 Stat. 566)). This is the earliest cash entry sale by David in Josephine County for the parcel that would become the Maplebrook Orchard.

1876 Hugo Donation Land Claim (DLC) On July 19, 1876 Caroline Niday and the heirs of Niday were issued a DLC patent for 321.88 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No.1479). David and Caroline Sexton would become major landowners in Hugo beyond the original DLC applied for by Hiram and Caroline Niday.⁴

David Sexton: 1850s - 1908

1870 Census David was a toll bridge keeper and Caroline was keeping house. Their children, Charlie Sexton, Frank Niday and Nellie Niday, were with them.


1876 Lucky Queen Post Office David Sexton was the first Postmaster of the Lucky Queen Post Office in 1876. He served through 1879, then his step-son Frank Niday served through 1886.⁵

David's First Cash Entry Became Maplebrook Orchard

1895 Pioneer Hugo Garbers owned the parcel at least by 1895. The Town of Hugo received its name with its first post office in 1896, named after Hugo Garbers.

1960s - 1970s Maplebrook Orchard The only Hugo orchard, besides the Echo Cove Orchard, to survive for awhile was Peter Pirzer's Maplebrook Orchard (walnuts and cherries) under management of the Foehlingers and Hasis during the 1960s - 1970s.⁶
